Principal's Report

Farewell Year 12

Last Friday Bright P-12 College farewelled our class of 2018 Year 12 students with a celebration day that

involved the whole school, P-12. It was a great day for everyone involved. I have been teaching for 34 years - yes, a long time and this celebration day was the best ever. There was no damage, no disruption to other year levels, no trashing lockers and no mess. This meant the final assembly held by the Year 12s had a relaxed and easy-going atmosphere and everyone could acknowledge the year 12s without bitterness. Later that evening we held their Graduation Dinner, the first time we have held the Graduation Dinner this early, and it was fantastic. Year 12, you have set the bar high.

The Year 12 VCE/VET students are now engaged in studying for their end of year exams or working and preparing for next year in the case of VCAL students. Year 12 is a significant year for students, parents and teachers. It is the end point of 13 years of primary and secondary education within the school sector and a transition point into a wider future outside the boundaries of school and the local community. For many of our students, next year will bring significant change, moving to a larger city for further education, taking a gap year and moving into the workforce. I have no concerns or apprehensions around the future directions of this year's Year 12 graduates of Bright P-12 College. They have developed into fine young citizens who now take their place in Australia and the world. I wish you the very best for your exams and the future.

Planning for 2018

We are now well into planning the educational program of Bright P-12 College for 2019. Class lists are being established P-8 and elective subjects in the secondary area 9-12 finalised. In some areas of the College, class numbers are very tight for 2019 and I therefore ask families who may be leaving the College at the end of 2018 to advise the office, the class teacher or Year Level Coordinator as soon as possible to allow us to make informed decisions around class groupings.

ACRE Leadership Forum with Bill Lucas.

Last week I attended a Leadership Forum held by ACRE (Australian Centre for Rural Entrepreneurship) in Beechworth with students and teachers from Years 5/6. Bill Lucas is Director for the Centre for Real World Learning (CRL) at Winchester University in England and is internationally regarded for his expertise and research in rethinking the purposes of schooling and vocational training. He has also written many books, one of which, *Power up your Mind*, is a personal favourite.

During the session, I was part of a panel consisting of Bill, students, teachers and Matt from ACRE discussing education and the impact of programs such as the Social Enterprise project our students in Years 5/6 have been involved in over the last 3 years. The capabilities taught during such a program are vital to future proofing our students and developing the skills and knowledge needed to thrive in the world. The capabilities play a vital role in global education and

must be considered as important in a child's education as literacy and numeracy.

After the panel discussion Bill presented certificates to Ciaran O'Connor, Breanna Rouse, Jimmy Sides and Freya Whyte for their involvement in developing teaching materials around the social enterprise project and the capabilities.

Jenny and I have attended two more days of training in Benalla this week. It gave us the time and opportunity to reflect on how we can create and support a more inclusive school environment here at Bright P12 and build the student voice and agency of all of our learners.

Lots of activities are on the go at the moment or recently concluded. The Year 5 and 6 Swimming Program, Life Education and Year 3 and 4 Town Quiz all occurred in the first couple of weeks. The planning is nearly complete for our Year 3 and 4 and Year 5 and 6 camps later this

term as well. Some of our Year 5 and 6 students were lucky to be selected for Somers Camp too in early December. The 3/4s visited the Shire Offices today and are riding to Porepunkah on Friday. The Bike Ed program has been occurring during PE time.

5/60 are currently working on a fabulous project for mathematics where students are designing sections of a mini-golf course and putting their knowledge of angles into real life situations.

The Gamagori visit has certainly been a highlight too. Thank you to John Henstridge and Keiko Sanderink who hosted some wonderful learning opportunities for all of our students, where our students could learn specific skills and art techniques with our visitors.

Blog from Germany

Last weekend, I went with my host family to a mountain called **Petersberg**. It has a church on top of it, and from the road it looks like it would be impossible to build it there. The church was first built in 1137, but has been rebuilt a few times over the years.



This Sunday, we went to a **salt mine** near Salzburg, called **Salzbergwerk**. The mine first started 500 years ago. Today, it still produces about 900,000 cubic metres of brine per year.

The tour that we went on starts with a train which takes you underground. We travel for a few minutes, and then get off in a big cave called the salt cathedral. To get down in to the bottom of the cave we have to go down a steep wooden slide that miners used to use to get to work. We follow the guide

through tunnels, looking at some information as we go, until we get to an underground salt lake. The water is so clear that you can't see it if you aren't looking closely. The tour gets on a boat, and as we move across the lake we watch a light show.

We walk along some more tunnels, learning about different mining technology, until we get back to the train. It was very interesting to see what a mine looked like 500 years ago, before Europeans had come to Australia.

Year 7 Boys Group

During Semester Two I have worked together with Rob Taylor, our Youth Worker from Alpine Health. We have been piloting a Year 7 boys' group focussing on emotional intelligence. All Year 7 boys have now had the opportunity to undertake the group. The first two groups ran in term 3 and the last two are well underway with only a double period session left for both groups.

During the 5 lessons we have defined and discussed the meaning of 10 words, played some fun games to understand each other better and tried to get to know ourselves better. During the last session we have celebrated with the boys making

their own crest/shield and sharing morning or afternoon tea.

The words we have explored are:

Respect, Empathy, Caring, Support, Respectful listening, Compassion, Trust, Honesty, Kindness and Resilience.

If you have a son in Year 7, it would be great for you to have a chat with him about his understanding of these words and how important understanding and using these skills and values are in shaping their futures.




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
