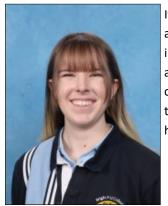






## STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

# Yr 1/2 JAPANESE



Students are learning about traditional Japanese toys.

They had an opportunity to practice Kendama. This skill toy consists of a handle (ken), a pair of cups (sarado), and a ball (tama) attached to the handle by a string. This requires good balance and patience trying to catch a ball with one of the









# Yr 7 METALWORK

Year 7 Metalwork is all about developing accuracy and precision - key skills in any hands-on trade. Students put these principles to the test by creating a Colorbond carry tray from sheet metal, quickly discovering the importance of measurement tolerance.

Every marking-out step must be within 1mm of the plan. For example, if Jimmy rules a line at 22mm when the plan specifies 20mm, he'll need to rub it out and redo it to meet the strict tolerance requirements.

Once students have mastered accurate marking out, they move on to cutting, folding, and pop riveting their tool trays together, transforming a flat sheet into a functional masterpiece. It's a lot of fun!

















# PREP/Yr 1 MUSIC

Prep/Year 1 students have been learning to play the ukulele. Strumming C major chord, they sang along to 'Row, row, row your boat' and had fun shouting out during the last verse "... if you see a crocodile, don't forget to scream!"









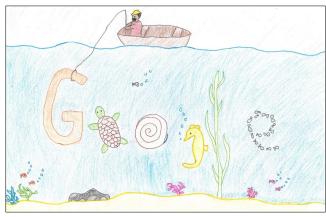
# Yr 8 VCD

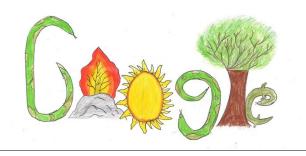




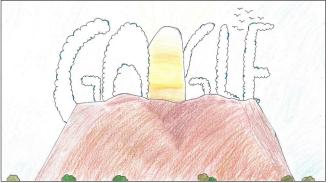












## Yr 10 SPORT COACHING & THE COMMUNITY

In Term 2 they will have an opportunity to coach junior interschool sport teams.

#### SUSTAINABILITY - Yr 4 PLANTING

Primary students have embarked on a hands-on learning adventure in the outdoor classroom, using plant growth to explore measurement. On the 4th of March, they planted broad beans and have been tracking their progress. Some have already grown up to an impressive 20cm tall! Each week, students check on their seedlings and make predictions about how tall they will be. This activity builds scientific curiosity and also sharpens their estimation and observation skills. Words such as germination, photosynthesis and tendrils have been added to their vocabulary. The beans will soon find their new home climbing a trellis in the College garden, where they will continue to grow and flourish as the students learn about fertilisers, soil and PH. By early Term 3, we expect to harvest the pods and enjoy the fruits of our labour with a cooking and tasting experience. It's a fantastic way to celebrate teamwork, patience, and the joy of nurturing nature. Stay tuned for updates on how our broad bean journey blossoms!

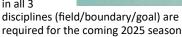
