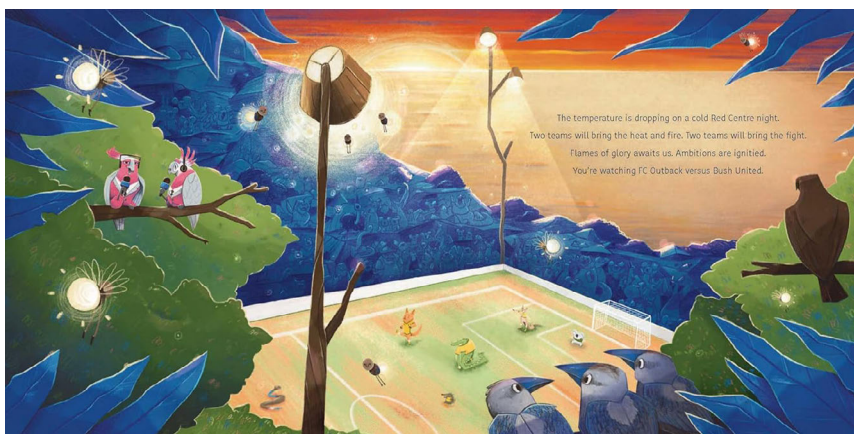
## Bright P-12 College Newsletter

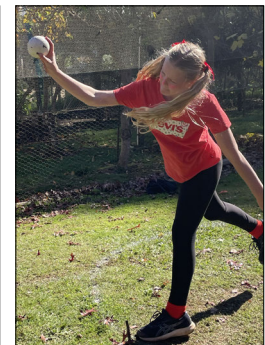

Cooper spoke about mental health, resilience, connection and wellbeing in a way that was genuine, engaging and incredibly relatable while also reinforcing so much of what we're already working towards through The Resilience Project with Secondary students.

Year 12 student Lucy C attended the community event and had this feedback "I left the Good Human Factory event feeling grateful, motivated and uplifted — it was such a beautiful and positive night. I took away so many valuable things from the session that I know I'll carry with me every day."

About Cooper Champman: Founder of The Good Human Factory, Cooper delivers talks focused on improving mental health through simple, practical daily habits. Drawing on his experiences as a professional surfer and mental health advocate, he encourages people to view mental health as something everyone has and can actively strengthen. His presentations emphasise small actions - such as gratitude, mindfulness and kindness that can improve wellbeing over time. The overall message is that becoming "1% better each day" can have a powerful impact on resilience, connection, and overall mental health.

## LEGAL STUDIES EXCURSION

Year 11 Legal Studies students visited the Supreme Court in Wangaratta. They were lucky enough to have their cases heard before a retired County Court judge with 24 years of experience behind her. Students prepared as part of the prosecution and defence teams, developing witness statements and practicing cross examinations as well as opening and closing statements.



On the day, our students were accompanied by members of Beechworth Secondary College who played the role of jurors for our case and vice versa, giving students exposure to what actually happens in a secretive jury deliberation.



Experiential learning like this is a vital part of the Legal Studies course and for some of our students has solidified their motivation to enter the legal profession. Amazing work legal eagles!



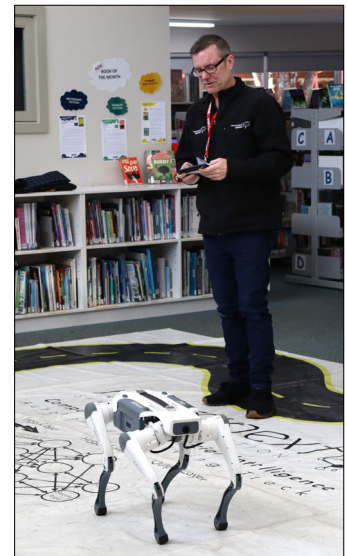


## CAREERS - AI INCURSION

A group of students at Bright P-12 College recently chose to participate in a session with Adrian from Neuranext.AI to learn about Artificial Intelligence (AI). During the workshop, students had the opportunity to explore:

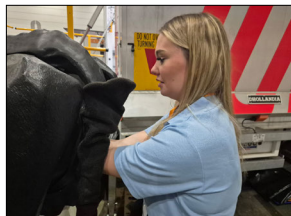
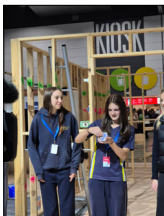
- the current state of the art in AI and the computing breakthroughs that drive AI
- the key scientific concepts of computer vision and how AI labels unstructured data
- live computer vision applications, such as object and face detection
- cutting edge AI powered quadruped robotics, including programming the robots to complete tasks
- discussing AI jobs and careers

The session was very informative and students were particularly captivated with the capabilities of the robots and how this technology is being used in real world scenarios.



## CAREERS - TRADE & TECH EXCURSION

Last week, 18 students ventured to Melbourne to attend the Trade and Tech Fit expo at the Convention Centre. The Expo was abuzz with female and gender diverse students from across the state exploring around 100 exhibitors from a range of traditionally male-dominated industries. Students were able to speak directly with tradespeople, apprentices and industry professionals involved in aviation, gaming, cloud and robotics, fashion, agriculture, essential services, clean energy, the traditional trades plus more.





# CAREERS - TRENDS IN THE WORLD OF WORK

The world of work is constantly transforming. Young people today are likely to have multiple careers across their lifetime, rather than staying in one job. Skills like adaptability, curiosity and a willingness to learn will be valuable for young people to develop. Many new career opportunities are emerging due to advances in technology and artificial intelligence. Roles such as data scientists, app developers and cybersecurity analysts are in demand - and not just within technology companies. These roles now exist across a wide range of industries, including healthcare, finance, education and even agriculture.

Jobs that respond to climate change are creating new pathways and call on skills in long-term thinking. Careers in the green economy are growing, including renewable energy scientists and urban planners focused on designing sustainable, 'green' cities.

There is also strong and ongoing demand in healthcare and social assistance. This includes careers in aged care and allied health, supporting the wellbeing of our communities. In addition, as the need for lifelong learning continues to grow, careers in education and training - such as teachers, online learning designers and corporate training specialists - will play a vital role in preparing the future workforce.

Learning the skills to help manage their life-long career journey will help young people manage the career reconfigurations they may need to do. These skills include communication skills, team-work, problem solving, decision making and reliability.

At Bright P-12 College, we work with students to help them understand themselves, know the world of work and be proactive about planning for their futures. In future editions of the newsletter, we will provide tips and ideas on how parents can support career curiosity at home and showcase other industries in strong demand.
